#### Welcome

Welcome to June's *Care for Creation*. We are thrilled to share the news that <u>the diocese has approved £10 million expenditure on environmental works</u> to improve the carbon footprint of our vicarages.

Did you know that the Climate Change Committee in the United Kingdom estimate that more than 60% of the change required to get to Net Zero involves personal behavioural change by individuals and communities: change focussed in the three areas of transport, home heating and diet?

We've concentrated on energy savings and reducing pollution in this newsletter. There are many options for taking action. What might you try?

### The earth is the Lord's

This was the title of <u>Bishop Steven's address</u> to Diocesan Synod on 11 June. At the meeting the major investment in our clergy housing was approved, in line with our diocesan environmental policy, to bring our clergy housing nearer to our Net Zero carbon targets. Bishop Steven also announced a small <u>revision to our liturgy</u> for baptism and confirmation services to include safeguarding our environment, the Church of England's fifth Mark of Mission alongside the others.

Church lighting energy savings - and free site visit

Did you see the <u>Let there be light</u> news item on our website? St Lawrence's Church in Bradwell obtained funding to change their lighting to LEDs and have benefitted from better aesthetics, reduced maintenance and lower energy use. Look out for their open day in September if you'd like to visit.

All Saints, North Moreton switched all their 32 lightbulbs to LED lamps, which greatly reduced the energy used for lighting. From our <u>energy audit programme</u>, we've learnt that switching to LEDs is one of the simplest and quickest ways to pay back energy savings for most churches.



## Saving energy and money at church...

Another of our churches, St Kenelm's, Minster Lovell, benefitted immediately from an energy audit assessment when the auditor advised that a heater left on constantly, with the aim of preventing damp in a storeroom, was not necessary, an extractor fan would do. Turning off the heater was predicted to save them 6480 kWh of electricity annually, over £700 a year in 2019 alone.

N.B. some churches require a setback heating level to be maintained for heritage preservation, so do check with the DAC or your archdeacon before making any major heating changes.

We are aware that rising energy prices are causing significant challenges for individuals, as well as churches, so we have gathered some resources to support you:

- If you are near Oxford there are many <u>Green Open Homes</u> you can visit between 18-29 June and an Energy Saving Fair in Oxford Town Hall, 10am to 4pm on Sunday 26 June.
- Repairing items rather than replacing them saves resources and money. Read about the Winslow Repair Café.

## **Energy Footprint Tool (EFT)**

Please encourage/offer to help your church treasurer to complete the **Energy Footprint Tool** for your church before it closes at the end of July.

We are given the information from the national church once the data is compiled so can share news of good tariffs we identify.

107 of our churches have started completing the EFT online, but only 61 have submitted their form so far – thank you to those who are working on this. Don't worry if you can't answer all the questions; you can still continue past the notification and submit your form.

If you don't have access to your church Parish Returns account, you can just complete a very short <u>2021 Word form</u> and email it to <u>environment@oxford.anglican.org</u> for us to enter for you.

### Clean Air Day

The Action for Clean Air website has plenty of information including a tool for you to measure your own air pollution footprint and resources to help individuals and communities, businesses and schools take action. Oxfordshire schools may be interested to know that the Oxford Friends of the Earth Schools Clean Air Network has air quality monitoring equipment to loan out to schools. Schools and children's groups can also use our Be Carbon Free activities.



## **Cleaner travel**

Cycling is low cost, good exercise and non-polluting. Bike Week ran from 6-12 June this year and their <u>inspiration for cycling</u> page, with ideas for families, cycle-commuters and routes to try, is available to peruse. If driving is unavoidable, here are some tips to make your journeys more <u>fuel efficient</u> and therefore save money and reduce pollution.
