Dear Parishioners and Friends of All Saints, Boyne Hill,

One of the most creative and happy times at All Saints, at least during my time as vicar, was when we met at All Saints Junior School to share Messy Church activities and a lovely homecooked meal. At its best Messy Church brought a good number of families together to enjoy activities, eucharistic worship and the shared meal. During Lockdown many church communities saw the need to worship outside, and beginning at Easter 2021 we shared our first Sundays @4 service with activities. This developed and we began to share simple worship, activities, and a BBQ to finish. This summer of 2023 we have been sharing with our all-age congregation themes from 'Caring for the world we live in – Messy Church Goes Wild' edited by Lucy Moore, the Messy Church Founder.

Messy Church Goes Wild is the movement within Messy Church which aims to encourage churches to meet God outdoors, love the natural world, experience a sense of awe and wonder there and to be more ecoaware in all that we do for the good of the planet. In June we looked at the value of trees and plants to the eco-system and in July (In the pouring rain) we thought about caring for the climate and our weather. In the July Sundays @4 the children were given small maps of the world to see where the weather was impacting negatively the welfare of people and all living beings. The children wrote prayers and placed the prayers on countries that were suffering such as Greece and Southern Europe that had terrible fires, parts of Africa that were suffering droughts and tragically if we were sharing this exercise now the devastation caused by Hurricane Dora and the wildfires in Hawaii. On September 24 at 4.00pm we will share a service caring for animals and our pets marking the festival day of St Francis of Assisi which falls on 4 October.

As part of our Sustainability programme and our ministry to families we will share a walk at Ockwells Park this Sunday (20 August). I know this walk well as it is the way I enjoy relaxation and refreshment during the day walking my dog, Lilly. Ockwells is part of a local nature reserve in Cox Green and is owned by the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead. This conservation area has a circular walk with information boards on wildlife and plants. The paths and trail around the park allow people to explore areas of woodland, meadow and copses. You will find plants, insects, and birds.

In 2012 the Brownies, Scouts and Cubs helped other volunteers to plant 800 trees including aspen, crab apple, dog roses, field maples, hawthorn, hornbeam, lime and oaks. (Information on the local website). In more recent times more trees have been planted and indeed there are signs for locals to offer time to offer to help with planting even more.

In James Martin's excellent book 'Learning to Pray – a guide for everyone' we discover in his chapter on 'Discovering God in Creation' that spending time outdoors is good for mental, emotional and physical health.

It can also, writes Martin 'connect us with God at a deep level. Within the chapter we read about Pope Francis and his environmental document Laudato Si and he writes "We are invited to see that every living creature – not only every human being is valuable and therefore worthy of our care.' Also, we read 'the entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil. Water, mountains, everything is, as it were, a caress of God'.

Please take the opportunity to share this hour long walk this Sunday afternoon meeting at Ockwells Park at 2.30pm followed by the opportunity to enjoy a cup of tea or coffee at the café near the car park.

EPISTLE Romans 12: 1-8

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God — what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.
